ELDERSHIP REPORTS

Senior Pastor

It seems not very long ago that I wrote my last report, and very little has changed in the intervening months. I continue to be optimistic about the spiritual health of the church and the faithfulness of the God who loves us. This does not mean however, that we are immune to the difficulties and uncertainties that plague a fallen world. With the onset of winter and the colder weather we have seen an increase in such illnesses as flu and COVID. This has seen ministries such as Make and Mingle interrupted, as well as a number of folk inclined to stay away due to health concerns. I personally was hit hard one week, (fortunately falling over on a Monday and recovering at week's end) and think that this is probably going to be an issue that we, and every church, has to live with moving forward. COVID has forced the church to think thoughtfully and theologically about what it means to live as the church, and how we respond to the concerns everybody has. It isn't easy but it is achievable. I know it is because God is the one who is sovereign and who is guiding and leading His church. He gives to us strength when we are weak, courage when we are fearful, hope when we have none, and the sure and confident knowledge that no matter what happens, nothing can snatch us out of His hands.

Volunteers

We all recognise I'm sure, that gifts are given to people and can only operate when individuals are prepared to offer themselves in the service of others for the work of the Lord. Church is not a place to sit and simply receive. It is the body of believers coming together and washing one another's feet. Here at BBC we have many folk doing just that. From greeting at the door on a Sunday morning, to preparing morning tea, to leading us in worship, to broadcasting messages, to teaching our children, to collecting our offerings, to locking up when everybody has left the building, to helping run mid-week playgroup and so much more. We serve because that is exactly what God has called us to do. Jesus Himself came to serve not to be served. If the King of glory led the way (showed us what it looks like to be God's image bearers) we should respond by doing likewise. If you are yet to find a ministry of service in the body of believers that God has made you a part of, please speak to me and I'll find you a place to do just that.

- NextGen (Sunday mornings)
- AV [audio visual] (Sunday mornings/Sunday evenings)
- Pastoral Care Team (Wednesday 10am meet and share with the Pastor)
- Mid-week playgroup (Wednesday mornings)
- Stewards [offering and monthly communion] (Sunday mornings)
- Greeters (Sunday mornings)
- Morning tea (Sunday mornings)
- Make and Mingle [setting up tables, preparing morning tea] (Wednesday mornings)
- Grounds and gardens (As you are available)
- Youth Group (Friday nights)
- Worship (Sunday mornings/Sunday evenings)
- Hospital packs [help pack] (as required)

Life Groups

There are a number of groups that operate in the life of the church in a variety of locations on a variety of days. If you are not a part of a group please consider it. Yes there will be a cost - you will have to give up a couple of hours once a week or once a fortnight to gather in someone's home. The rewards however, are potentially life changing. You'll grow closer to your brothers and sisters as you minister to one another. You'll be able to call upon those in your life group when prayer is needed. You'll study the Bible together and ask questions together and discover answers together. As far as pastoral care goes, Life Groups are the perfect setting.

Sunday Gatherings

"let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Hebrews 10:24-25

Whatever you have to do, make gathering with your brothers and sisters a weekly priority. There is good reason for this, both practical as well as theological.

- the Lord commands us to do it (always the best reason to do anything)
- it is in the context of gathering that the church exercises its gifts
- we witness to everyone that assembling with our brothers and sisters matters
- we join with the host of heaven praising the Lord Jesus
- we only have so many Sundays in us to do it, once they're gone, they're gone
- we open up God's Word together
- we celebrate communion with our brothers and sisters
- we join with our brothers and sisters in prayer
- we live counter-culturally

Each of these reasons stand alone and all of them have tremendous value, both now in this present age, and eternally as we see how it is that God was glorified when His people stopped what they were doing in order to meet together, sing His praises, hear from Him, and witness to a watching world.

Sermon series

All of (most of) the sermons preached during the morning and evening services at BBC are recorded and can be viewed on our YouTube channel. You can catch up on the entire Gospel of John series, or else you might like to catch up on a particular sermon you missed. Either way they are a valuable resource that I hope you will use for your own edification and even by directing someone to them as a way of sharing your faith. Incidentally YouTube can be a great way of spreading the Good News if you desire to see the Word go out into all the world. Every time you press 'like' or 'share' when you watch a video, you potentially expand the reach of that video. A simple way of looking at it is like this - 'likes' and 'shares' begat more views. If you've ever thought to yourself "what's the point of clicking on and liking" That's the point. With the click of your mouse you can help spread the Word.

Family Camp (Phillip Island Adventure Resort)

Initial planning for a church family camp in February 2023 has begun. A minimum number of 55 individuals are required in order to secure cabins. The camp will run from Friday night and conclude following lunch on Sunday. This will be the first time since COVID hit our shores that we as a church will have had the opportunity to get away together, spend time enjoying the great outdoors, share around the table, and join in a time of encouraging one another. Sunday morning we will worship together, and we will also have the opportunity to ask the elders any question you like during a once in a year "ask the elders" session on Saturday evening. For the braver souls there will be a number of activities available to get the heart pumping from flying fox to archery. Costs will range from \$183.00 per adult to \$138.00 per child. Families in full attendance only have to pay for adults and two dependent children. All other dependent children are free of charge. Our regular Sunday worship service will convene at BBC for those who for a variety of reasons are unable to come.

I rejoice greatly in what God is doing in the life of His people here at BBC. I look forward with anticipation at all He is going to do through His people as they commit themselves to loving and serving Him in the months and years ahead.

Secretary

Community Assistance Fund

The BBC Community Assistance Fund, (formerly the BBC COVID-19 Assistance Fund), is in its second full year of operation and saw growth in local reach and impact throughout FY-22. The Fund transitioned from a 'COVID-19' to a general financial assistance fund as COVID restrictions were lifted. Giving to the Fund also increased thanks to the generosity of the BBC Community. Financial hardship within the community hasn't abated as rising costs of living puts pressure on household budgets. God willing, the Fund will continue to meet needs as He provides.

Changes

In November 2020, the Fund changed its name to the BBC *Community Assistance* Fund and the Fund's purpose and eligibility was expanded to provide support and relief to persons experiencing *general* financial difficulty and hardship in addition to loss of income as a result of COVID-19. This transition coincided with the lifting of lock-down restrictions in Victoria in October 2021 and ensured the ministry remained effective and relevant in a post-COVID lock-down environment.

The Fund is now able to provide support not only to individuals and families but also to small business owners and sole traders experiencing financial difficulty and hardship. Eligibility also expanded to anyone over the age of 18 living in the City of Casey or Cardinia Shire Council, to recipients of any Centrelink Income Support Payment (not just a COVID-19 related payment) and to

people experiencing serious hardship because of family tragedy, financial misfortune, serious illness and business closure.

Support continues to be provided in the form of grocery gift cards ensuring relief is directed towards food needs and essential items. Importantly, the Fund's core purpose remains unchanged – that is to respond to the calling to be generous (2 Corinthians 9:11), to share what we have (Hebrews 13:16) and to give to those in need (Luke 12:33-34).

Impact

Over the course of FY-22, the Fund has been able to impact the lives of many within our local community in a very practical way:

- We provided assistance to 73 families and individuals.
- We were able to hand over \$30,950 in grocery vouchers in person.

Once again, the Fund has been generously supported by the BBC community with over \$19,000 donated to the Fund in FY-22. Over \$6,000 alone was raised during our Christmas fundraising campaign.

Pastoral Care

When a church speaks of Pastoral Care there are at least three avenues we are essentially looking at.

The first is organic pastoral care. Organic pastoral care happens when in no organised or formal way a need is recognised and that need is met. Most often, not always but often, we hear of someone who needs some special care and God lays it upon my heart to minister to that need, and so I meet it. It might be a friend or it might be someone I don't know particularly well at all, but because I've heard about their situation I provide in some small way whatever I can to help alleviate their concern. It might be in the form of a card I write to them. It might be in the form of a meal I deliver to their door. It might be to sit with them and pray with them. It might be that I visit them in hospital. In any event, the care is organic and it just happens. This kind of pastoral care should exist, I think, in every Christian church.

The second is slightly more formal but still has that organic element. This kind of Pastoral Care is provided largely through Life Groups and various associations that exist in the church. When a Life Group comes together they hear firsthand that someone in the group is in need in some way. The group or people within the group then take it upon themselves to minister to whatever need is brought before them. This is one reason why Life Groups are so important. Journeying together through God's Word is important and even foundational to why they meet. But alongside of that is genuine care and support by members in those Life Groups to one another.

The third type of care is much more formal but just as important as the first two. It consists of men and women who come together weekly or fortnightly for the purpose of looking at the needs they are aware of, and together they seek to minister to those needs as they can.

Presently there are five of us who constitute the BBC Pastoral Care team - Jean Hall, Ellen Hanna, Jan Ketcher, Warren White and myself. We meet fortnightly (Wed 10:00am) in my office, to get up to date with pastoral concerns, to pray, and to look at if and how we might be able to assist in ways that say, "you are loved."

Please let me know if you would like to contribute in any way, and especially if you think God might be able to use you as a part of the BBC pastoral care team. A church our size would welcome ten to twelve carers.

One thing that can be improved is the activities that we run before studies. We often have "themed" nights or run various active games (e.g. dodgeball, hockey, etc) before the studies, and while they are fun we are lacking in new material. If anyone has active indoor games they think would be great for 20-30 teenagers, we would love to hear it.

Once the youth are equipped with a solid knowledge of God's Word, as well as their own personal convictions, having them share their testimonies to other youth, to the church, and to non-believers is the next step we would love most (if not all) of them to achieve. At the moment in our studies we are learning why we believe what we believe, and tackling hard questions like "How do we know the Bible is reliable?", or "What if Jesus didn't really die? What if he was faking it?" It's these questions that challenge the kids to think deeper, and to find the facts that back up the Bible. Once they have those, and equipped with both their faith and personal testimonies, they can better explain the Gospel to those who need to hear it.

All of these mission works are being (in the case of Andy and Cathy Staunton, have been) supported financially on a consistent and ongoing basis. From 01 July 2021 to 30 June 2022 BBC through the Missions Committee distributed to our Missions Partners a sum of \$37, 404.22. This amount was provided by the generosity of the congregation through its weekly giving, donations, and a fundraising concert. The Missions
