AV Ministry

AV (Audio-Visual) at Beaconsfield Baptist Church functions as a crucial yet deliberately behind-the-scenes ministry, using technology to support and enhance the worship and ministry experience. Working closely with the Worship and Pastoral teams, our mission is to create an atmosphere conducive to connecting with God and experiencing spiritual growth during church services. It is rewarding to know that we play an essential part in this while utilising our God-given talents and skills.

I want to take a moment to express my heartfelt gratitude to the team for their dedication and hard work in serving our church community. One aspect that stands out is the amazing teamwork and the way you always find a way to make it work. May you continue to find fulfillment and joy in your ministry, knowing that you are making a significant impact on the spiritual growth of our church.

The team consists of 15 dedicated volunteers who serve in three specialised roles: Sound, Media, and Broadcast, with each weekend requiring five roster positions to be filled. Additionally, nearly half of the team members contribute to other Sunday rosters, making for some busy schedules.

Currently, we are actively seeking Media operators for both AM and PM services. As a Media operator, you will be responsible for projecting song words, sermon slides and videos during the service. This role requires basic computer skills and a time commitment for rehearsals and serving 1-2 weekends per month. Please reach out if you would like to know more.

While live broadcasts may not be as popular as they were in the last two years, they continue to serve a dedicated segment of our church community. These individuals consistently tune in on Sunday mornings, preferring the convenience and accessibility of online church. We are grateful for their continued engagement.

During our AM live broadcasts, we typically have over 30 devices connected, reflecting the number of households participating in this format. Additionally, our sermon recordings uploaded to YouTube attract an average of 500 views per month, reaching a broader online audience beyond our immediate community.

While the demand for live broadcasts has fluctuated, we recognise the significance of these virtual connections, especially for those who may be unable to attend in person due to various reasons. As we move forward, we aim to strike a balance between in-person gatherings and online engagement, ensuring that all members of our church family feel connected and valued.

Community Assistance Fund

The BBC Community Assistance Fund is in its third full year of operation and continues to provide support and relief to those experiencing financial difficulty and hardship. Rising inflation, interest rates and costs of living have made FY-23 a particularly challenging year for many within our local community.

This year the Fund:

- Helped 29 families and individuals.
- Handed out \$9,600 in grocery vouchers in person.

The majority of people assisted were referred by family and friends. Many also came through the BBC website. A number of referrals were made by Orange Door, an organisation that supports those affected by family violence.

Once again, the Fund has been generously supported by the BBC community with over \$9,000 donated. The table below provides a summary of Fund performance during FY-23.

Pastoral Care

In my previous report I mentioned that the church (every church) has three avenues by which pastoral care is delivered to the congregation.

- Organic Pastoral Care
- Life Groups
- Formal Care

Organic care just happens. I hear my brother or sister is sick, and I offer to help. I call them. I make them a meal. I run an errand for them. Unfortunately not everyone is aware of how their brothers and sisters are travelling. From time to time needs are left unaddressed. Not because no one cares, but because people are either unaware or else they are distracted by other matters requiring their attention.

That's why Life Groups are so important. In a church our size it is possible for brothers and sisters not to pick up on or see when others are experiencing difficulty. We may not even be aware you're missing when we gather on a Sunday. Not because we don't care, but because life has a habit of getting in the way. Members of a Life Group will, more often than not, be aware of how everyone else in the group is travelling. As such, they will be best positioned to meet the concerns of their brothers and sisters in the Life Group. Such care occurs outside of Life Groups as well, but those who are part of a Life Group have access to consistent and even immediate pastoral support.

Formal care, the care I want to speak briefly about in this report, is provided by a team of people who meet weekly or fortnightly to pray for and (where possible) call on those who are walking a difficult path. Whether physical sickness strikes, or mental health has taken a hit, or some other need hasn't been met, a pastoral care team, when they know about such needs, can step in. In order to pray specifically for you, message you, send you a card, call upon you; we need to know of any concerns you might have. Please do let one of us know and we'll be sure to pray for you, and where possible, provide any practical assistance as might be timely and appropriate.

Presently there are seven of us who constitute the BBC Pastoral Care team: Jean Hall, Ellen Hanna, Jan Ketcher, Dorothy Clayton, Heather Young, Rowen Crouch and myself. We meet fortnightly (Wed 10:00 am) in the church, to get up to date with pastoral concerns, to pray, and to look at if and how we might be able to assist in ways that say, "you are loved."

Please let me know if you would like to contribute in any way, and especially if you think God might be able to use you as a part of the BBC pastoral care team. A church our size would welcome ten to twelve carers.

Playgroup over 2022-2023 has been growing, with many new families coming in and staying, and we are so thankful to God for His hand over playgroup this year. Playgroup is a wonderful opportunity for non-Christians (alongside some Christians too) to come into a church, find a community of other mums and families, and to hear about God and His love for them, as well as being a fun, warm environment for families. We have had various themes over the past year, using the significant events in the Christian calendar like Easter and Christmas to share the hope and truth of Jesus with the families, and have also had other themes like 'who is Jesus,' 'thank you' and 'autumn.'

Playgroup is a multicultural, multigenerational group that even includes dads and grandparents and has on average between 5-9 families attending per week. We have been blessed by Make and Mingle's generous donation (and other people donating their loved toys), so that we can provide new outside play equipment that both kids and parents love! At the end of each session, we read a fun Bible-based story and finish with a poem prayer as a blessing over them for the rest of the week, which also serves to teach them how to pray.

We have been very thankful to the wonderful team of volunteers who faithfully serve God through this ministry, and especially thank Ruth as she heads overseas for mission and pray that God continues to use her for His mission. We are praying for a new volunteer to step up because of this. Eileen also makes a fun craft every week that the kids are thrilled by. We would love to have the room painted if possible; we took everything off the walls as it desperately needs a fresh coat of paint.

We have had so much positive feedback from parents on the lovely atmosphere of Playgroup, for both the children and parents themselves. They appreciate the good clean facilities, good outdoor space and the flexible, safe and friendly environment. Some felt comfortable sharing their problems, appreciating that we will pray for them, and we've heard lovely stories from parents who say that Playgroup has helped their child develop and grow in playing with other kids, communicating with all ages and that they are always so excited to come each week. One parent said their child loves Playgroup so much that while travelling to church in the car, they try to guess what the craft will be that day. We're so thankful to God working through Playgroup, and for the ways that He has brought many families into this community that seeks to be His light in our local area (particularly post-Covid).


